BEARS AROUND THE WORLD ARE DIFFERENT AND ALIKE IN MANY WAYS...



Our last theme, 'Bears around the world are different and alike in many ways' offered children an opportunity to inquire, ask questions and use their thinking and research skills to construct understanding and build upon their new knowledge. The children built a conceptual understanding of sizes through comparing big and small bears. They explored different types of bears, namely the Brown bear, Panda bear and the Polar bear. Through transdisciplinary art and craft activities they discovered that bears are of different colours, shapes and sizes. They worked collaboratively, using their fine motor skills through hand printing on the enormous bear. Their understanding of bears expanded from a mere toy teddy bear to different bears around the world. Further, through ICT sessions, they learnt about the different food bears eat and the factors that determine their habitats. They enthusiastically prepared brown bear sandwiches using honey and gems and relished the sweet honey. We also used this topic to introduce students to classics such as Winnie the Pooh, Brown Bear and We're going on a Bear

Hunt. Students learnt new positional words and built their listening skills through watching a puppet show Goldilocks and the Three Bears.
