Curriculum Roadmap Day

The school will host a Curriculum Road Map Day (CRMD) for all parents on Friday, 3rd August, 2018 from 9:30 am - 11:30 am.

Indus Early Learning Centre, as part of its educative journey, espouses a unique curriculum that is both inquiry-based and concept-driven. What this means is simply that we encourage the children to learn through asking questions, researching the answers, and that all teaching and learning is centered on themes that are relevant to their lives. The IB inspired curriculum, on which our IELC curriculum is based, explores six fundamental questions through the Units of Inquiry. These concept-based questions are a powerful vehicle for promoting meaning and understanding of self, the world, and others.

This is a presentation by your child's teachers, which offers an overview of the year's curriculum, as well as the classroom schedule and routines. Topics will include communication procedures and preferences, parent involvement in the program, curriculum overview, assessments, and essential school policies. If you have more than one child at IELC, please plan for both parents to attend so that one of you may be present for each classroom presentation.

Important IELC Policies :

School Timings:

School will open for the students on Monday, August 7th, 2017.

The school timings are as follows:

Pre Nursery	9:00am – 2: 30 pm

Prep 1	9:00am – 2: 30 pm
Prep 2	9:00am – 2: 30 pm
Grade 1	9:00am – 2: 30 pm

For the morning of August 6th, parents may want to walk with their child into the school. When your child is comfortable with coming to school, you may simply drop your child off at the gate where the class assistants and teachers will be waiting to welcome the children. Dispersal will commence at 2: 30 pm and the teachers and class assistants will accompany the students to the main lobby, where they will be handing over to registered guardians.

Food and Water:

Students will have two food breaks during the course of their day. The mid-morning snack has to be bought from home and we strongly recommend healthy nutritious options. If you wish you may send a late afternoon snack for children to eat before they go home. Lunch will be provided and a menu of the same will be shared with you. Our caterer will provide hot lunch where you have an option of choosing between a veg/non veg selection. If for some reason you would prefer to send food along with your child, you may do so, but please may we request you to kindly inform us in advance so that we can then inform our caterer and avoid any wastage of food from happening.

Please do send a labelled full bottle of water to school with your child every day in his/her backpack and we will refill the same during the course of the day. We do have a microwave and fridge in school for storage and warming up of food! We encourage all children to have a balanced diet and monitor the lunchtime to ensure the same. If your child has any specific nutritional requirement or allergies, please do notify the grade teacher immediately. Safe drinking water is available in dispensers and we advise children to bring their own bottles to refill.

Information and Communication:

Every grade teacher sends out a monthly newsletter giving you information on the unit of inquiry/theme and of any specific grade-level activities and trips. In addition to this, the teachers also send a monthly calendar which will keep you abreast of the happenings on a daily basis. A monthly newsletter also goes out from the Head of Centre with updates of the bigger picture and school activities.

The student diary is your first point of contact with the teacher and it needs to be checked and signed by the parent every day. Please be sure to fill in the details at the front of the diary (and keep them updated) so we can contact you if required. The

grade teacher will also list her phone number so you can contact her but we request you to call only if required and at an appropriate time. All teachers have official school email ids and you can communicate with them directly for any clarifications or queries.

Leaving School Early:

If for some specific reason you need to pick up your child early from school you will be required to fill out an “Exit Slip” which needs to be signed by the Head of Centre. These forms are available with the grade teachers. Students will not be permitted to leave the school premises without this form.

Birthday Celebrations:

If you wish to celebrate your child’s birthday class at school, you may coordinate with the class teacher. **Our policy is to allow parents to come to the class on Friday’s for cake cutting with the class.** Kindly coordinate the same with your class teacher.

Field Trips:

Field trips will help children further understand what we are inquiring about. It is the experiential aspect of the theoretical things we learn. Field trips will be organized by the school and are related to the unit of inquiry/theme during each term. Parents will be notified in advance and will be required to sign a consent form permitting your child to attend. Parents are welcome to join us as volunteers.

Academic Calendar and Parent Teacher Meetings:

A copy of the Academic Calendar will be handed to you, apart from the same being shared in the Student Diary. We have three terms. In the first and second term we will conduct a 3 Way Conference (Parent Teacher Meetings), and the last term will have a Student Led Conference. Should you wish to meet with your child’s class teacher at any other time, please do send a note through the student diary to fix an appointment at a mutually convenient time.

3 Way Conferences:

There will be a total of three parent teacher meetings through the year. We term our PTM’s as Parent teacher Conferences and Three-Way Conferences respectively.

The first two terms we have two Parent Conferences where parents and teachers will discuss the child’s timely progress. These sessions will give the parents and teacher’s an opportunity to see the work their children have done and receive a one-on-one report on the progress they have made and discuss strategies to support them further. In the last term we have the Three-Way Conference where the students take a lead in taking the parents through their respective portfolio’s, workbooks and pieces of work.

Information on Student Led Conferences:

There will be a Student Led Conference at the end of the year where the students will take their parents through their portfolio’s and all the work they have done over the year and explain each piece of work, activity, the reasons behind doing it and their learning’s.

In all three terms an E-report and a Portfolio are shared by the Class Teacher with parents.
